Please check all boxes that apply under each Healthy Yard category to <u>receive A FREE SIGN</u> that will be personally delivered to your house:

Sustainable Gardening/Lawn Practices [Check at least two options]

- □ Reduce Lawn Areas
- Use Native Plants
- □ Remove Invasive Plants
- □ Practice Integrated Pest Management
- Responsible Watering Practices (e.g.: early am, rain cut-off, infrequently)
- ☐ Use Rakes, Brooms or Mulch instead of Leaf Blowers
- □ Drip or Soaker Hose for Irrigation
- □ Leave Grass Clippings in Place
- □ Mow High

Organic Practices [Check at least one option]

- ☐ Eliminate Chemical Lawn Fertilizers
- ☐ Eliminate Chemical Lawn Pesticides (including tick/mosquito sprays)

Soil and Water Conservation [Check at least two options]

- □ Compost
- □ Capture Rain Water from the Roof
- Reduce Erosion (Ground cover, terraces)
- □ Rain Garden
- □ Mulch Leaves
- □ Limit Water Use



Pollinator Pathway:

Take your healthy yard pledge a step further and join an expanding network of properties in Rye and beyond that are establishing pollinator-friendly habitats and food sources for bees, butterflies, and other pollinating insects and wildlife. Pledge takers will have their properties **highlighted in green pen** on the City of Rye Pollinator Pathway map housed in the foyer of the Rye Nature Center.

Organic Practices [Must check]

 Eliminate the use of all chemically derived pesticides, insecticides, herbicides, fungicides, fertilizers etc., except on <u>rare occasions</u> to resolve an infestation or to improve habitat for native plants and wildlife

Native Plants [Must check]

 Plant and maintain at least three native plants on property (can be trees, shrubs, flowers etc)
